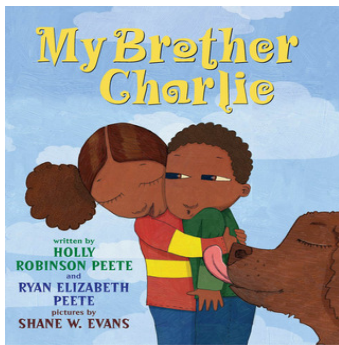


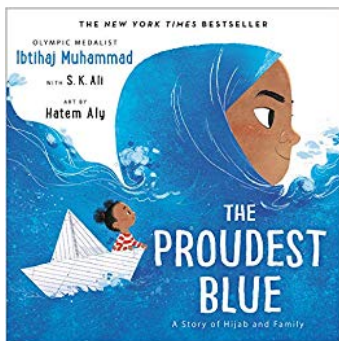
Racial Literacy Club: Book List

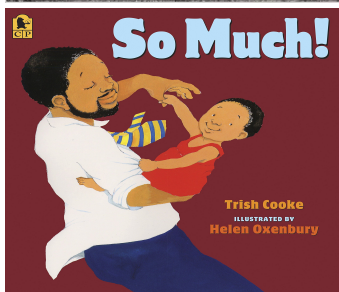
First Snow
